2000 — Present Collaborative Research Participants

THE NORTHEAST CONSORTIUM has been funding collaborative research projects within the Gulf of Maine and Georges Bank ecosystems since 2000. To date, over 190 projects have been funded, involving over 515 commercial fishermen, 45 industry organizations/businesses, and 235 research scientists and 140 students from 70 research institutions/agencies. This document provides a summary of participation in cooperative research over the years. The information presented has been gleaned primarily from project reports that have been submitted to the Northeast Consortium. Thus, the numbers are considered best-estimates only and, in many cases, are considered minimums.

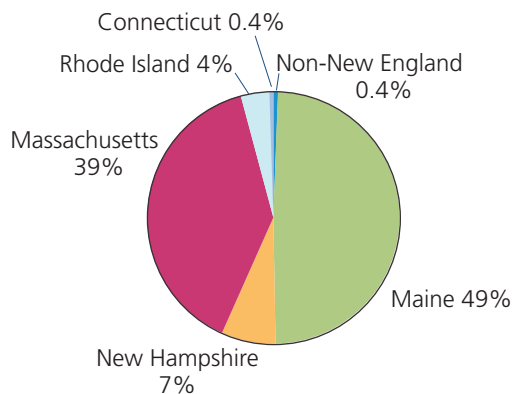
The tables list the number of industry and science participants involved in collaborative research and project development awards over the years and the pie charts show the geographic distribution of participants. "Fishermen" include the fishing vessel owners and captains. Many of the industry organizations and scientific institutions or agencies that have been involved are listed. The Northeast Consortium does not have a specific requirement for the number of new participants each year. However, it has generally been the case that at least 40% of the participants each year have been new to the Northeast Consortium, with averages that are significantly higher than that.

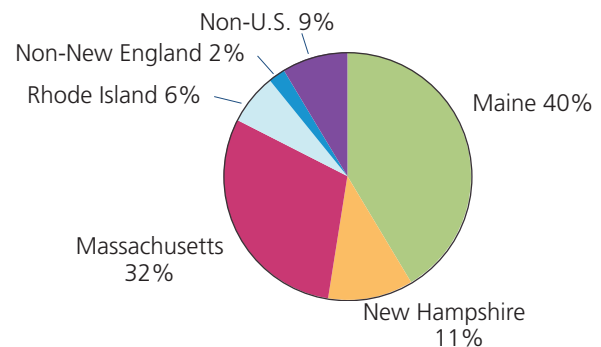

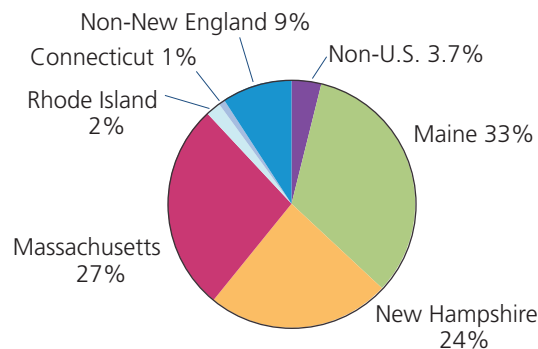

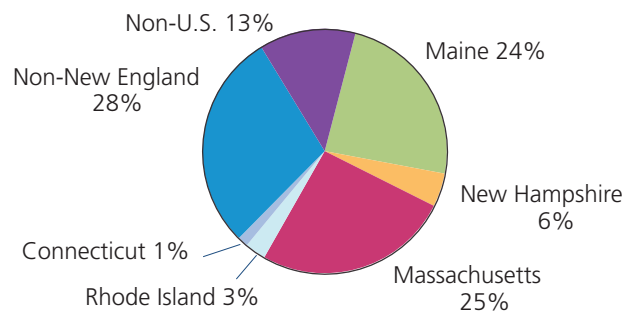
